AIR SUSPENSION COMPRESSOR REMOVAL

- 1. TURN THE AIR SUSPENSION SWITCH TO THE OFF POSITION. (REFER TO THE OWNER'S MANUAL FOR SWITCH LOCATION).
- 2. OPEN THE HOOD OF THE VEHICLE.
- 3. UNBOLT AND REMOVE THE WINDSHIELD WASHER RESERVOIR TANK TO GAIN ACCESS TO THE COMPRESSOR ASSEMBLY. (FIGURE 1)

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4. DISCONNECT THE AIR LINES BY FIRST DEPRESSING THE ORANGE COLORED QUICK-CONNECT LOCKING RINGS WHILE PULLING SIMULTANEOUSLY OUTWARD ON THE AIR LINE. (FIGURE 2)

- 5. CAREFULLY DISCONNECT THE ELECTRICAL CONNECTOR.
- 6. UNBOLT THE THREE (3) FASTENERS RETAINING THE COMPRESSOR ONTO THE VEHICLE, NEXT REMOVE THE ASSEMBLY FROM ITS MOUNTING LOCATION. (FIGURES 3,4)



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PRE-ASSEMBLY OF THE AIR SUSPENSION COMPRESSOR

2. INSTALL THE MOUNTING BRACKET ONTO THE NEW COMPRESSOR ASSEMBLY.
YOU WILL USE THE SUPPLIED BOLTS AND WASHERS, WHILE TAKING NOTE OF
ANY PREINSTALLED FASTENERS (FIGURE 7)
MAKE SURE TO INSTALL THE MOUNTING BRACKET IN THE CORRECT ORIENTATION. (FIGURE 8)

PROPER PROCEDURE FOR ASSESSING YOUR AIR SPRINGS CONDITION:

- 1. TURN OFF AIR SUSPENSION SWITCH IF EQUIPPED.
- REFER TO OWNER'S MANUAL FOR PROPER LIFTING TECHNIQUES AND JACKING POINTS.
- 3. RAISE THE VEHICLE.
- 4. INSPECT AIR SPRINGS FOR ANY TYPE OF CRACKS OR EXCESSIVE WEAR. CRACKS IN AIR SPRINGS ARE EVIDENT IF THEY ARE LEAKING. THIS WILL CAUSE THE COMPRESSOR TO OVERHEAT FROM CONTINUOUS OPERATION.

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
