WARNING:

The air suspension system is under pressure (up to 10 bar, or 150 lbf/in). Verify pressure has been relieved and disconnect power to the air suspension system prior to disassembly. Do not allow dirt or grease to enter the system. Always wear standard hand, ear, and eye protection when servicing the air suspension system.

- Not to be stored below 5°F (-15°C) and above 122°F (50°C).
- Avoid damage to air lines and cables.
- Removal and installation is only to be performed by fully qualified personnel.
- Use car manufacturer's diagnostic software.

CAUTION:

Damage to the vehicle and air suspension system can be incurred if work is carried out in a manner other than specified in the instructions or in a different sequence.

To avoid the possibility of short circuits while working with electric components consult your owner's manual on how to disconnect your battery.

Consult your vehicle owner's manual, service manual, or car dealer for the correct jacking points on your vehicle and for additional care, safety and maintenance instructions. Under no circumstances should any work be completed underneath the vehicle if it is not adequately supported, as serious injuries and death can occur.

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AIR SPRING REMOVAL

- 1. Lift the vehicle per manufacturer's instructions.
- 2. Deflate and disable the air suspension system per manufacturer's instructions.
- 3. Remove the lower air spring retaining bolt. (Figures 1, 2)


4. Remove the upper air spring retaining bolt. (Figures 3, 4)




FIGURE 5 FIGURE 6

5. Carefully remove the air spring from the vehicle, to gain access to the air line. (Figures 5, 6)

6. Remove the air fitting from the air spring. (Figures 7, 8)

Prior to inserting the existing air line into the new air strut you will need to remove the old original equipment air line fitting and discard.



Scratches and/or deep cuts in the air line can result in possible leaks. Inspect the air line before insertion. Air line needs to be replaced if damaged.



AIR SPRING INSTALLATION

1. Remove the shipping pin from the installed air fitting on the new air spring. (Figure 9)

2. Insert the air line into the air fitting. (Figure 10)

3. Route the air line through the retaining features on the air spring top mount. (Figure 11)

4. Install the air spring into the suspension. (Figure 12)

5. Re-install the upper air spring retaining bolt. Tighten to manufacturer's specifications. (Figures 13, 14)
